Abbreviations and Symbols in Notes

- Please note that these are just suggestions.
- Feel free to find / develop / use your own abbreviations and symbols.
- The main thing is to be totally sure what your abbreviations and symbols mean





Abbreviations: Consonants


- Nation ntn
- National ntnl
- Nationality ntnty

• notional? = context or notnl





Abbreviations: suffixes





Verbs

- Arrows for past and future realz = realized devlp = will develop
- Dot before or after for past or future
 realz = realize / o realz = realized / realzo = will realize
- Or use abbreviated endings: d, ll, ld, ing



Adjectives

- Use a "plus" or a "tick" or a smiley sign to note a positive adjective
- Use a "minus", an "x" or a "sad face" to note down a negative adjective

Examples: Interesting conference: √ cnfrnc |+ cnfrnc

Boring presentation: prsntn x | prsntn 🐑



Adjectives

• Use underlining or double / triple sign for emphasis:

Examples:

<u>Cnfrnc</u> \checkmark | Cnfrnc $\checkmark \checkmark$ - really good conference, wonderful conference <u>Prsntn</u> x | Prsntn x x - really poor presentation, awful presentation




Symbols – easy to read and write
